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What is ORTA?

- <u>On-line Randomized Trials Access</u>
- Web-based application for registration and randomization of patients into EORTC clinical trials
- Control & monitor patient enrollment

*On-line Randomized Trials Access (**ORTA**) credentials are sent as automatic e-mail message from Randlog@eortc.org to your inbox (or spam folder).

First time login will prompt you to **immediately change your password; afterwards, you are asked to update **every 3 months**. Do **not** use accents in your password.

How navigate in ORTA? (1)

Enter EORTC institution number

Click on 'Details'to open the EORTC clinical trial page with trial details after entry of the protocol number



The dropdown list 'Step' allows you to register a new subject ('1 – New patient'), continue next steps with registered subjects ('x – Existing patient') or blinded treatment allocation of registered subjects ('Resupply treat.') according to the protocol setting
